To ensure a strong physician workforce, both today and for the future, the Foundation provides more than half a million dollars of annual tuition assistance through scholarships, student loans and fellowships, as well as year-round leadership and educational opportunities to shape the next generation of Wisconsin physicians.

Wisconsin medical students gain research experience under the guidance of a physician mentor through the Foundation’s summer fellowship program. In 2017, five student fellows researched diverse topics related to urgent health needs in Wisconsin, including improved prenatal health interventions for homeless women, screening and referral practices for opioid use disorders, a comparison study of treatment offered to patients on government-funded health care plans, emergency physicians’ use of the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program and the effects of a best-practice alert on smoking cessation rates.

Past Foundation fellowship recipients presented their research locally and regionally in 2017, including two who published their findings in the Wisconsin Medical Society’s peer-reviewed journal *WMJ*.

To advance the health of the people of Wisconsin, the Foundation’s physician-led board identified priority areas of strategic focus, including increased access to mental and behavioral health care.

In support of that focus, Aspirus, Inc. in Wausau was awarded a Foundation grant that enabled them to expand mental health access in 16 rural central and northern Wisconsin counties through telemedicine. A Foundation grant also supported an accredited training for physicians focused on opioid prescribing guidelines during the Wisconsin Medical Society’s Annual Meeting.

The Foundation’s grant program provides support for innovative, physician-led, community-based or statewide health education initiatives and research projects aimed at improving health in Wisconsin. This year’s grant recipients support healthy communities through such projects as school and community gardens, music therapy for the elderly, enhanced access to telepsychiatry in rural areas and professional translations of advanced care directive forms.

The Foundation's *Prescription for a Healthy You* program is implemented annually at several locations across the state to encourage youth to consider careers in medicine and health care and to prevent chronic disease through healthy habits including healthy eating, getting active, drinking water and mindfulness to promote well-being. The Foundation proudly creates, supports and expands opportunities for Wisconsin youth and their families to make healthy decisions.

Corina Norrbom, MD, a family medicine physician and faculty navigator at Medical College of Wisconsin—Central Wisconsin (MCW-Central), introduced the Foundation's *Prescription for a Healthy You* program at the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Wausau Area. All 25 first-year MCW-Central students led fun, hands-on activities throughout the afternoon that reinforce healthy living messages for youth ages 7 to 14.

Recognizing Leaders

In addition to supporting leadership development opportunities, the Foundation celebrates current and future leaders through several student and physician awards.

The Superhero of Medicine Award recognizes outstanding physicians who live out the mission of the Foundation to an exemplary degree, going above and beyond to improve the health of their patients and community. The 2017 recipient, Heather Schmidt, DO, was nominated for her vision and tireless pursuit of meaningful impact for the community she serves. Doctor Schmidt is instrumental in leading Healthy Fond du Lac County 2020 efforts, the Walk With a Doc and Total Living programs and other disease prevention activities. She also has served as co-facilitator of the Wisconsin Medical Society's *Leading Healthy Work Systems* leadership program.





Investments in Public Health*


